SANDS of TIME

Human footprints dating back more than 850,000 years, discovered on Happisburgh Beach in Norfolk, are thought to be the oldest found outside of Africa. After a decade of combing the eroding stretch of coast for signs of early life, scientists and archaeologists have suggested the footprints belonged to a small group of adults and children wandering what would then have been an estuary rich in saltmarsh, shellfish and grazing bison (happisburgh.org).
