1 FIRST FUSION Combining the rich flavours of Malay cooking with delicate Chinese preparation, Peranakan cuisine is one of the world's oldest fusion cuisines. Sample delicacies such as *bakwan kepitng* or *otak otak* at The Blue Ginger in Singapore. www.theblueginger.com

3 BANGED UP ABROAD For anyone who has seen *Midnight Express*, the idea of ending up in a Turkish prison on holiday is probably a waking nightmare. Not so at the Four Seasons' spectacular Sultanahmet property in Istanbul, which has been converted from an Ottoman jailhouse into a luxury hotel – what was the exercise yard is now a beautifully landscaped garden. www.fourseasons.com/istanbul



5 CELESTIAL SUMMIT Lording over the Himalayas at 8,848 metres high, Mt. Everest is a conquest written into the destiny of every serious mountaineer. Book a ticket with Buddha Air. The small aircraft takes off from Kathmandu Airport, Nepal and the great Himalayan summits reel off in regal procession. Finally, there's Everest – lofty, enigmatic, the highest of them all. www.mountainflights.com

8 ANGAMPORA In a suburb of Colombo, Sri Lanka it's possible to experience one of the world's most endangered martial arts. *Angampora* has been around for centuries, but today just a few select masters keep it alive. 10 THE GREATEST GATSBY In 1974, South African Rashaad Pandy invented a sandwich know as the Gatsby, which stuffed huge amounts of chips, meat, salad and chutney into an impossibly large bread roll. 2 GLADIATOR TRAINING For a chance of all the glory and none of the bloodshed, it's possible to train as a gladiator in Rome, Italy. 37 **TWO WHEELING** For a different way to travel in Jakarta, Indonesia, try a bicycle taxi. You get the seat, while the driver stands as he pedals. Given the traffic conditions, it's often the fastest way to go. www.jakarta-tourism.go.id

38 **HATS AND HOTELS** The G Hotel and Spa in Galway, Ireland, was designed by renowned milliner, Philip Treacy. Like his hat-creations, the hotel features bright hues and dramatic colour contrasts. www.theghotel.ie

27 **SYDNEY'S SUPERSTAR** Looking at Australia's Sydney harbour-front, it's impossible to imagine any other focal point than the iconic ridges of the Opera House. 34 **FRIES WITH THAT?** Belgian *frites* are supposedly the world's best French fries, twice-fried for an extra crunchy crust. 40 **HAUTE HIDEAWAY** For a rural getaway in the UK, try Belle Grove Barns in Suffolk. The family-owned barns have been lovingly converted into luxurious yet comfortable self-catering apartments, sleeping up to eight people. www.bellegrovebarns.com

41 **PERKS IN THE PARK** Free Shakespeare in the Park is held at the Delacorte Theater in Central Park, New York – USA, with two productions presented over the course of the summer.
